

ESOL Endorsement (English for Speakers of Other Languages)

The Kansas State Department of Education provides for an ESOL endorsement for teachers holding an initial Kansas teaching license, or for those in the process of completing their initial license requirements. It is recommended that undergraduates interested in the ESOL endorsement take LING/ANTH 106 early in their program. The first ESOL course completed should be the methods course (C&T 330/331 or C&T 620/820). Classes at the 700 level or higher are graduate level, which may help with pay in some districts and count toward a master's degree in the C&T Department (with the exception of C&T 739, Internship in Teaching).

Faculty Advisors for ESOL: (Students wanting to pursue the endorsement should sign up for an ESOL faculty advisor through the C&T office.)
